

# \*\*\* 2013 Tournament Playoff Procedures \*\*\*

## Overtime Situations

### **Five (5) minute playoff:**

A five-minute playoff (not sudden death) will immediately follow regulation play if regulation time has ended in a tie. The players on the field for the playoff need NOT have been on the field at the end of the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter. If the game is still tied after the five (5) minute playoff time expires, players MUST STAY ON THE FIELD and wait for further instructions from referees and RYS officials prior to the "5 by 5 shoot-out" occurring.

Each team will be issued a single time out during the five (5) minute playoff period.

### **"5 by 5 Shoot-out":**

The initial selection of five (5) players and a goalie from each team must come from the players on the field AT THE END OF THE FIVE (5) MINUTE PLAYOFF.

The goalie MAY NOT be a shooter during the same "5 by 5 shoot-out" in which they are playing goalie.

If the first "5 by 5 shoot-out" results in a tie, the second "5 by 5 shoot-out" must be first populated by the remaining players that were on the field at the end of the playoff (that were not selected for the first "5 by 5 shoot-out"), then populated with players from the bench (or the goalie from the 1<sup>st</sup> round) that were not part of either the first "5 by 5 shoot-out" or the ending of the playoff. NOBODY shall participate in consecutive "5 by 5 shoot-outs" as a shooter (unless their roster has been depleted by players not in attendance or injuries as described below and they have less than eleven (11) players available).

The goalie of the first "5 by 5 shoot-out" MAY participate as a shooter in the 2<sup>nd</sup> "5 by 5 shoot-out" or they may continue to play the goalie only in the event that there are still players on their team that have yet to shoot. Once ALL players (even goalies) have had an opportunity to shoot, then players may shoot a second time. No shooter shall have the opportunity to shoot a third time until all players (even goalies) have had a chance to shoot the second time. The same applies for subsequent rounds of the "5 by 5 shoot-out".

The "5 by 5 shoot-out" scenario is repeated until an eventual winner is declared.

In the event of an injury to a player during the game or the five (5) minute playoff in which they are physically unable to kick the ball, they shall not be considered eligible for any round of the "5 by 5 shoot-out" in any capacity (shooter or goalie).

In the event of an injury to a goalie during the "5 by 5 shoot-out", their replacement must come from the pool of players that are not in the current pool of shooters. Their replacement will be selected by their own coach.

Once a player has been replaced or eliminated due to injury during ANY portion of the "5 by 5 shoot-out", they will be ineligible for that "5 by 5 shoot-out" and ANY subsequent "5 by 5 shoot-outs" necessary to determine the outcome of that game.

In the event that a player injures themselves during the act of kicking the ball during the "5 by 5 shoot-out", their attempt counts.
